CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Pastor: Repent! Turn around! Quit going your own way lest you drown in your own desires. Thus says the Lord of the second chance.

People: O God, we acknowledge and admit our neglect of You and our desire to shut You out of our life. Our sin often overwhelms even our best intentions. Remembering our Baptism and Your power to drown the old sinful nature, we ask You to bring forth a new person in us through the resurrection of Christ. Hear us, receive us, wash us, and restore us to be the chosen possession of Your great love. Amen.

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE:

OLD TESTAMENT READING: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

Reader: God's first and second messages to Jonah were the same: warn sinful Nineveh. In between these two messages came Jonah's attempt to run away from God—always a bad idea—and his reluctant obedience. After the second message came the repentance of Nineveh, God's sparing of the city, and Jonah's anger at God's mercy. And a plea for death. Jonah simply could not stand God's goodness to people he doesn't like!

3 The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: ² "Get up! Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach the message that I tell you." ³ Jonah got up and went to Nineveh according to the LORD's command.

Now Nineveh was an extremely great city, a three-day walk. ⁴ Jonah set out on the first day of his walk in the city and proclaimed, "In forty days Nineveh will be demolished!" ⁵ Then the people of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and dressed in sackcloth—from the greatest of them to the least. ¹⁰ God saw their actions—that they had turned from their evil ways—so God relented from the disaster he had threatened them with. And he did not do it.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

PSALM: Psalm 62

Reader: In this liturgical hymn, the speaker describes threats of violence against him, the comfort that his enemies, like all people, weigh less than steam, and the fact, stated twice, that God is his rock and salvation. Let us read it together, responsively.

I am at rest in God alone; my salvation comes from him. People: He alone is my rock and my salvation, my stronghold; I will never be shaken.

Reader: How long will you threaten a man?

Will all of you attack

as if he were a leaning wall, or a tottering fence?

People: They only plan to bring him down from his high position.

Reader: They take pleasure in lying; they bless with their mouths, but they curse inwardly.

People: Rest in God alone, my soul, for my hope comes from him.

Reader: He alone is my rock and my salvation,

my stronghold; I will not be shaken.

People: My salvation and glory depend on God, my strong rock. My refuge is in God.

Reader: Trust in him at all times, you people;

pour out your hearts before him.

People: God is our refuge.

Reader: Common people are only a vapor; important people, an illusion.

People: Together on a scale, they weigh less than a vapor.

Reader: Place no trust in oppression

or false hope in robbery.

People: If wealth increases, don't set your heart on it.

Reader: God has spoken once;

I have heard this twice:

strength belongs to God,

People: and faithful love belongs to you, Lord. For you repay each according to his works.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE (LETTER): 1 Corinthians 7:29-35

Reader: Paul was expecting that Jesus would return soon--"the time is limited....the world in its current form is passing away." Therefore, marriage is a distraction from the "things of the Lord." Earlier in this passage, Paul says "I have no commandment from the Lord, but I give a judgement as one who by the Lord's mercy is trustworthy." (7.25)

Given that statement, and given Scripture's many statements in favor of marriage, we cannot construct a universal prohibition of Christian marriage from this passage. What we must learn from it is to examine our focus, our concentration on the "things of the Lord."

²⁹ This is what I mean, brothers and sisters: The time is limited, so from now on those who have wives should be as though they had none, ³⁰ those who weep as though they did not weep, those who rejoice as though they did not rejoice, those who buy as though they didn't own anything, ³¹ and those who use the world as though they did not make full use of it. For this world in its current form is passing away.

³² I want you to be without concerns. The unmarried man is concerned about the things of the Lord—how he may please the Lord. ³³ But the married man is concerned about the things of the world—how he may please his wife— ³⁴ and his interests are divided. The unmarried woman or virgin is concerned about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy both in body and in spirit. But the married woman is concerned about the things of the world—how she may please her husband. ³⁵ I am saying this for your own benefit, not to put a restraint on you, but to promote what is proper and so that you may be devoted to the Lord without distraction.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 1:14-20

Reader: Here is the Lord and Master, in real life, on whom we are to focus all our attention, who is our rock and our salvation, and who calls us to freely give out His warnings and blessings without, like Jonah, getting grumpy about it! To put it in a nutshell, follow him.

¹⁴ After John was arrested, Jesus went to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God: ¹⁵ "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!"

¹⁶ As he passed alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew, Simon's brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ "Follow me," Jesus told them, "and I will make you fish for people." ¹⁸ Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ Going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat putting their nets in order. ²⁰ Immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.

Reader: This is the Special Good News of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, O Christ!
